Future Generations Afghanistan Empowering Vulnerable Communities to Shape Their Futures



FGA'S ONGOING PARTNERSHIP WITH FAO

FGA signed an agreement with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) to provide emergency livestock protection packages, technical trainings, and one-time unconditional cash transfers to vulnerable households. Each household will receive a cash transfer of \$96. The project was signed on the 15th of August 2023 and is expected to come to an end on the 15th of April 2024. Under this project, 2,950 households in Badghis and 2,800 households in Nuristan will benefit from livestock and unconditional cash transfers.



FGA IN SOUTHWEST

In south and west regions, over 24,501 animals in Badghis and Nimruz provinces, have received deworming medicine to maintain the health and well-being of the livestock, and 802 farmers have received training on animal health and nutrition. At the same time, 1032 households in Badghis received livestock protection packages, while 1,500 households in Kandahar were selected for a cash for work project. In addition, 200 households were selected to receive unconditional cash transfers, the financial assistance is provided to those living in extreme poverty and are unable to work.



Building Resilient Communities



Over the past month, Future Generations Afghanistan (FGA) has been actively working in Nangarhar province, where we have provided financial assistance and food to thousands of beneficiaries. FGA has successfully distributed over 24,185,600 AFN cash and 442 metric tons of food to 14,762 households in Nangarhar province under the WFP funded projects. At Future Generations Afghanistan (FGA), we are committed to building resilient communities and supporting vulnerable populations. Over the past month, we have been able to distribute over 12.8 million AFN cash assistance to beneficiaries in Nangarhar and 2.4 million AFN in Laghman provinces under the Resilient Food Systems (RFS) project.



EAST REGION

Over the past month, FGA has helped in building of 362 check dams and 700 trenches in Nuristan province to improve water conservation and agricultural productivity in the province. Additionally, 30 watersheds were completed, helping to manage water resources more effectively. In the same province, over 15,000 pullets were distributed to beneficiaries, while 1,000 households received training on wheat cultivation to improve their income and food security.



In Kunar province, FGA selected 90 households for Unconditional Cash Transfer (UCT) as part of its efforts to alleviate poverty and promote financial stability in the province. The cash transfers will help these households meet their basic needs, such as food, shelter, and clothing. In collaboration with the World Food Programme (WFP), FGA were able to Distribute 145.6 MT nutritious meals (HEB) to 111,995 students in Nangarhar province, which will help students in their physical and cognitive development.

FGA IN CENTRAL REGION

In September, 8 infrastructures were successfully completed in Wardak province, employing 1,400 workers through a cash for work project. The purpose of the project is to provide temporary employment opportunities to unemployed members of the community while also enabling the workers to contribute to the development of their communities. In addition, FGA selected 2,770 households in Logar province to receive wheat cultivation packages which will help them to enhance their livelihoods by providing them with the necessary materials and knowledge to grow wheat, thus promoting the sustainable development of agriculture in the province
